The sisters also tries to find them a job for these homeless after they are well and ready to go back to normal life), for the 9 electric heaters (for the use in room of their patients).

Our special project: 300 brand new blankets & 300 tarps (200 will go to the sisters of charity for the distribution to the poor and 100 to the homeless in the south bay), 100 sleeping bags for Jim's Project Homeless Help. The distribution will be on January 2017.
